## **ABSTRACT**

It is realized that English is the number one language in the world as it is used in most aspects of life. English is also spoken as a means of communication. Therefore, it is recommended that people understand English, so they can follow the development of the world.

However, English in Indonesia is a foreign language as it is not usually spoken in Indonesian society. As a result, numbers of Indonesian people do not understand English well.
