

Negative Impacts on Terrorists' Kids Concern Indonesian Commission

The commissioner of the Indonesian Commission for Child Protection (KPAI), Jasra Putra, has demanded that the police's Detachment 88 anti-terrorism squad (or Densus 88) is concerned with the possible negative impact on the small children whose parents were arrested and charged as alleged terrorists.

His statement is his response to the recent Densus 88 actions of arresting nine alleged terrorists in many different provinces in the country.

One of them, Khairudin (34), was arrested together with his wife (ANS) and their very young child [a kindergarten pupil] in Kendal, Central Java on Tuesday morning (24 October).

"The action took place on their way to take their kid to school right in front of their neighbourhood. The future effects, especially in dealing with the kid's identity and his social relation, should be well taken care," he was quoted as saying by kiblat.net on Thursday (26 October).

Mentioning about the kid's trauma and the rehabilitation needed, he said that the kid's basic rights would need respecting in the sense of being able to safely return to his school and play with his friends.
