## ABSTRACT

The topic idea of this thesis arose first when I read Aldous Huxley's foreword about his novel, <u>Brave New World</u>. He states that <u>Brave New World</u> is a book about the future. So, since <u>Brave New World</u> is a book about the future, I am sure there must be specific circumstances that inspired Huxley to write it, and specific message Huxley wanted to convey.

This thesis is an attempt to find out the historical background of the writing of <u>Brave New world</u>. But, since people should obey the law of the state and people who have their own ideas are regarded as the menace for the stability of the society, they should face the failure. They should admit that the stability of the society takes precedence over everything.
