CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

A.Background of study

Most of the English learners in Indonesia, SMA students as well as more advanced students, find difficulties in learning the combinations of verb + particle including the particles up and down since the Indonesian language has no such verb + particle combinations.

There are two main things which confuse them. The first one is the meaning. Sometimes the meaning of verb + particle up and verb + particle down combinations can be guessed from the meaning of the individual words, i.e. the meaning of the verb and the particle, such as "stand up" and "sit down". However, they frequently have new different meanings, for example, "bring up" means educate and "cut down" means kill.

The difficulty does not only lie in knowing the meaning of the combinations, but also knowing how they are used correctly in sentences. For some verb + particle up and verb + particle down combinations, the object can either precede the particle or follow it without a change in meaning; whereas, for others, the object must be placed after the particles.

To the more advanced learners, the problem of learning the verb + particle combinations becomes more complicated when they find some combinations of which

particles do not belong to the verbs but to the noun phrases that follow the particles.

The reasons mentioned above make the writer choose the combinations of verb + particle <u>up</u> and verb + particle down as the topic of this thesis.

B. Aim of study

The aim of this thesis is to find out the nature of the verb + particle <u>up</u> combinations and verb + particle <u>down</u> combinations by analyzing the meaning and how they are used in sentences and then to give an alternative way to teach the combinations.

C. Scope of study

In this thesis, the writer discusses only the combinations of verb + particle up and verb + particle down consisting of two words, a verb and a particle, since those are the material given to the students in Senior High Schools.

Moreover, the writer chooses the particles up and down firstly because the other particles have been discussed by other students and secondly, the two particles usually have opposite meanings so they are important for the analysis of the meaning.

D. Method of study

As the main source of the data, the writer has used

Oxford Dictionary of Current Idiomatic English. After collecting the data, the writer looks for their single-word synonyms, if any, in Oxford Advanced Learners' Dictionary and English Idioms and How to use them, and their translations, if any, in Kamus Inggris Indonesia or translates from the definitions given by the main source if the translations cannot be found in the dictionary.

Then, the writer lists the sentence examples of the combinations taken from the dictionaries. All of the data are arranged alphabetically into two parts: first, verb + particle up combinations and second, verb + particle down combinations.

For the discussions in Chapter III and IV, the writer used the data in Chapter II as the foothold. She also combined the opinions of some grammarians about verb + particle combinations to support the analysis in those chapters.

The discussion about the teaching of verb + particle up and verb + particle down combinations is based on the previous chapters and some books of English language teaching.

E. Presentation of thesis

This thesis is presented in the following way:

The first chapter is the introduction which tells us the background, the aim of writing this thesis, the scope of study, the method of doing the study and the presentation of the thesis.

Chapter II consists of the lists of verb + particle

up and verb + particle <u>down</u> combinations with their synonyms, if any, and translations in Indonesian. The next lists are the sentence examples of verb + particle <u>up</u> and verb + particle <u>down</u> combinations.

Chapter III discusses the meaning of the verb + particle <u>up</u> combinations and the verb + particle <u>down</u> combinations which is classified into three types. This chapter presents the data division according to the type of meaning.

Chapter IV deals with how the combinations are used in sentences. It is divided into two sections: phrasal verbs and prepositional verbs, which presents the sentence patterns of each section, the syntactic characteristics relating to the pattern and the phonological characteristic.

Chapter V talks about the teaching of the combinations of verb + particle up and verb + particle down by presenting a suggested teaching procedure.

The last chapter presents a conclusion of the whole discussions in Chapter II, III, IV, and V.

CHAPTER II

LIST OF VERB PLUS PARTICLE UP COMBINATIONS AND VERB PLUS PARTICLE DOWN COMBINATIONS AND THE EXAMPLES IN SENTENCES

CHAPTER III

MEANING OF THE COMBINATIONS OF VERB + PARTICLE UP AND VERB + PARTICLE DOWN

A. Types of meaning

Based on the data in Chapter II, the writer concluded that the meanings of verb + particle <u>up</u> and verb + particle <u>down</u> combinations, as Quirk, Greenbaum, Leech and Svartvik stated in their book A GRAMMAR OF CONTEMPORARY ENGLISH, can be classified into three types, namely:

- 1. The meanings of the combinations of verb + particle up and verb + particle down are derived from the lexical meaning of the individual words, i.e. the meaning of the verb and the particle. The following are the examples of such verb + particle combinations:
 - Please don't wait down there; come straight up.
 - The warm gases <u>bubbled</u> <u>up</u> through the water.
 - Since the old lady fell, she's been unable to go up steps.
 - He didn't <u>look up</u> from his newspaper when I entered the room.
 - She picked up the half-finished letter.
 - Smoke from the camp-fires <u>spiralled up</u> into a clear sky.
 - The collar of his overcoat was <u>turned up</u> against the bitter wind.

- They drive along with all the car windows wound up.
- Cats often find it easier to climb up a tree than to <u>climb down</u>.
- As the sun <u>went down</u>, the whole sky became suffused with a red glow.
- Sarah <u>looked</u> <u>down</u> in embarrassment.
- The rain poured down steadily.
- His hat was <u>pulled down</u> over his eyes so that nobody should guess his true identity.
- He <u>turned down</u> the brim of his straw hat to keep the sun out of his eyes.
- She wound down the window of her car and leant out to ask the way.

For such verb + particle combinations, there is a possibility of contrastive substitutions showing the individuality of the components.

- climb up * climb down
 - (up can be substituted by down and, in this case, the meaning of climb up is the opposite of climb down as it can be seen in the sentences above)
- go up * go down
- look up * look down
- wind up * wind down
- 2. The verb keeps its lexical meaning; whereas, the
 1)
 particle has an intensifying function. The examples of
 the verb + particle up and verb + particle down
 combinations are as follows:

Verb + particle up combinations :

- Alexander backed me (up) as he always did.
- They sent the invalid a 'Get Well' card to <u>cheer</u> him (up).
- The smaller rivers and streams <u>dry up</u> in the summer.
- You are not going to play until you have <u>eaten</u> all your carrots <u>up</u>.
- Within a few weeks their feet had <u>healed up</u> nicely.
- The flying spray had <u>iced up</u> every inch of the deck and everything on it.
- She could <u>knit (up)</u> a baby's coatee in an afternoon.
- John must <u>lie up</u> for a few weeks until his leg mends.
- I can't <u>match up</u> the two halves of the photograph.

 Verb + particle down combinations:
- The old lady <u>fell (down)</u> in the street and broke her leg.
- A line of poplars was <u>hew down</u> to make way for an ugly parade of shops.
- He <u>noted down</u> every word I said.
- The commission has ordered two mines to be <u>shut</u> <u>down</u>.
- Peter was coated in cement and sand, but we picked him up and <u>dusted</u> him <u>(down)</u>.
- I'm going to chop down some of the apple trees.
- He <u>washes</u> his car <u>(down)</u> with the garden hose on Sundays.

In the above sentences, we see that there are some verb + particle combinations of which particles are written in parenthesis. They denote that the particles can be deleted without changing the meaning. In other words, the particle deletion does not affect the meaning of the whole sentence. So, we can delete the particles in the following sentences without making any difference in meaning.

- They sent the invalid a 'Get Well' card to cheer him (up).
 - = They sent the invalid a 'Get Well' card to cheer him.
- She could knit (up) a baby's coatee in an afternoon.
 - = She could knit a baby's coatee in an afternoon.
- The old lady fell (down) in the street.
 - = The old lady fell in the street.
- He washes his car (down) with the garden hose.
 - = He washes his car with the garden hose.

When the particles are not written in parenthesis, they have intensifying function. The word 'intensifying' itself implies several meanings. Firstly, the particles emphasize the meaning of the verbs.

e.g.:

- If you want to go to the Continent for your holiday, you ought to book up now.
- That dog ought to be chained up; it's dangerous.
- These cornflakes have gone soft, but they'll be

- all right if you crisp them up in the oven.
- I wish the bus would hurry up and come.
- The horses were <u>saddled up</u> and ready to move.
- The sea calmed down as soon as the wind fell.
- The stamp had not been properly <u>gummed</u> <u>down</u>.
- Don't forget to put the postal order in before you stick down the envelope.

Secondly, the intensifying function of the particles implies the meaning of completeness, in this case, the completeness of the verb in verb + particle combinations. e.g.:

- Throw the scraps in the incinerator and <u>burn</u> them <u>up</u>.
 - = burn completely
- The smaller rivers and streams <u>dry up</u> in the summer.
 - = become completely dry
- You must <u>drink</u> your milk <u>up</u>, Ted, or you won't go out and play!
 - = drink the whole milk
- You are not going to play until you have <u>eaten</u> all your carrots <u>up</u>.
 - = finish eating all the carrots
- Within a few weeks their feet had <u>healed up</u> nicely.
 - = become completely healthy
- All the land few miles around has been <u>bought up</u> by one speculator.
 - = bought completely

- A mechanic <u>reckoned up</u> the cost of repairing the damage to my car.
 - = reckoned all or the total of
- He <u>used up</u> his reserves in fruitless counter attacks during the spring.
 - = used all his reserves

2)

- 'Intensifying' also means complete destruction.

 Here are the examples of verb + particle up and verb + particle down combinations of this meaning.
 - All the spare timber was <u>sawn</u> up to make logs for the fire.
 - = sawn into pieces
 - Did you mean me to keep the receipt ? I'm afraid

 I've torn it up.
 - = torn into small pieces
 - The place was badly <u>smashed up</u> in the air-raids.
 - = broken to pieces
 - Firemen had to <u>break down</u> a wall to get families trapped on the ground floor.
 - = break to the ground
 - The wood-shed burnt down in half an hour.
 - = burnt to the foundation

For the verb + particle combinations of the second and third meaning of intensifying, we cannot delete the particles since the deletion will change the meaning. Let us see in the following sentences:

- You must drink your milk up, Ted, or you won't go out and play!

The meaning of the verb + particle up combination in the

sentence is different from that of the following :

- You must drink your milk, Ted, or you won't go out and play!

In the first sentence, 'you' or 'Ted' must drink the whole milk; whereas, in the second sentence, 'you' is not obliged to drink the whole milk.

We can also see the difference in meaning in these sentences:

- Did you mean me to keep the receipt ? I'm afraid I've torn it up.
- Did you mean me to keep the receipt ? I'm afraid I've torn it.

The 'I' in the first sentence has torn the receipt into small pieces, however, in the second sentence, the 'I' has torn the receipt not into small pieces but maybe into two parts.

- 3. The combinations of verb + particle up and verb + particle down form new idiomatic meanings which cannot be guessed from the individual meanings of the constituent words. Most of the combinations listed in Chapter II are of this type. The examples of the combinations of this type are as follows:
 - I'm sorry I blew upat you this morning.
 - = lose one's temper
 - His invention was immediately successful, and in less than a year he <u>cleaned up</u> ten thousand pounds.
 - = make money
 - The general was content to <u>give up</u> a few miles of desert.

- = surrender
- You'll soon <u>pick</u> <u>up</u> after a day or two in bed.
 - = recover
- The smuggling organization wound up its activities and prepared to disband.
 - = stop, cease
- When he was proved wrong by the new evidence he was forced to <u>climb down</u> and accept that he was mistaken.
 - = withdraw
- There's somebody coming ! Keep down and don't make a sound.
 - = lie low
- She's always running her husband down in public.
 - = belittle
- If Tony wants the job I'll $\underline{\text{stand down}}$.
 - = withdraw one's application

From the above sentences, we can see that 'blow up' means lose one's temper, 'pick up' means recover, 'climb down' means withdraw, 'run down' means belittle, etc. The meanings of the combinations are very different from the meanings of the individual words; in other words, they cannot be learned from the meaning of the verb and the particle.

The other verb + particle combinations of this type of meaning are referring to the data numbers :

In such verb + particle combinations, we cannot make contrastive substitutions such as bear up - bear down, boil up - boil down, break up - break down, give up - give down, shake up - shake down, touch up - touch down, etc, because the adverbial, lexical meaning of the particles have lost and the combinations form new meanings.

Furthermore, most of these combinations have synonyms, for example, 'surrender' for give up, 'withdraw' for stand down, 'destroy' for bust up, 'descend' for flutter down and etc, as they can be found in Chapter II.

B. Possibilities in meaning

After discussing the types of meaning, we know that a verb + particle up combination or a verb + particle

down combination can belong to more than one type of
meaning. For example:

'tear up' belongs to two types of meaning

 Did you mean me to keep the receipt ? I'm afraid I've torn it up.

(type 2)

2. The other side clearly doesn't regard such agreements as binding, they can be torn at will.

(type 3)

'climb down' belongs to two types of meaning

1. Cats often find it easier to climb up than to climb down.

(type 1)

 When he was proved by the new evidence he was forced to climb down and accept that he was mistaken.

(type 3)

Moreover, a verb + particle <u>up</u> combination or a verb + particle <u>down</u> combination of the same type of meaning may have more than one meaning depending on the context in which it occurs.

e.g.:

'pull up' has three meanings:

1. stop

He pulled his car up within a few yards of the wreckage.

2. reprimand

Even his wife had to pull him up over his

wrong-headed this afternoon.

3. improve one's position

He pulled up to within a few yards of the leaders.

'stand down' has four meanings :

- 1. leave the witness box
 Unless you have any further questions for him,
 I think this witness may stand down.
- 2. disband, ends its life as an active unit Certain regiments have chosen to stand down rather than be amalgamated with other units.
- 3. relax

The troops were stood down only when it was clear that no attack was forthcoming.

4. withdraw one's application

If Tony wants the job I'll stand down.

CHAPTER IV

HOW THE COMBINATIONS OF VERB + PARTICLE UP AND VERB + PARTICLE DOWN ARE USED

After discussing the meaning of the combinations of verb + particle <u>up</u> and verb + particle <u>down</u> in Chapter III, in this chapter the writer wants to focus on how the combinations are used. Since there are two types of verb + particle combinations based on the function of the particle, the writer divides this chapter into two sections; first, phrasal verbs and second, prepositional verbs. As it is stated in <u>A Communicative Grammar of English</u>:

Verbs may form combinations with adverbial particles. Such verb-adverb combinations are called phrasal verbs. A verb may also form a combination with a preposition. Such a verb-preposition combination is called a prepositional verb. 1)

A. Phrasal verbs

From the data collected in Chapter II, the writer finds the examples of phrasal verbs:

- dig up - keep down

For complete explanation, the writer will discuss sentence patterns, syntactic characteristics relating to the sentence patterns and phonological characteristics of phrasal verbs so that we can understand more clearly how the combinations of verb + particle up and particle down are used.

This pattern is the passive form of pattern I and pattern II. The direct objects of the active sentences are transposed to the front position and the verb phrases are changed into the passive form. The adverbial particle follows the verb.

If the active sentences have two objects, indirect and direct object, there are two types of passive sentences.

e.g. :

- They sent down a list of missing stock to me.
 - $^{\sim}$ A list of missing stock was sent down to me.
 - $^{\sim}$ I was sent down a list of missing stock.

(2) Emphatic transformed pattern

When the subject of the emphatic sentence is a 2) pronoun, it must precede the verb.

- Down they (the prices) came.
- Down he went like a felled ox.

A.2. Syntactic characteristics relating to the sentence patterns

There are some syntactic characteristics of phrasal verbs relating to the sentence patterns with regard to the position of object for transitive verbs and the position of adverb for both of transitive and intransitive verbs.

a. Object

(1) Noun or short noun phrase object

Referring to pattern I and II, the noun or short noun phrase object of a transitive phrasal verb can be inserted between the verb and the adverbial particle or placed after the adverbial particle.

e.g.:

- They have brought up the baby.
- Our troops bore down all resistance.
- They have brought the boy up.
- Our troops bore all resistance down.

(2) Extended object

When the object is extended, the extension of it follows the adverbial particle or the whole of the extended object follows the adverbial particle.

- He will blow the photographs up that you choose.
- He will blow up the photographs that you choose.

(3) Personal pronoun object

In regard to pattern II, the personal pronoun objects always precede the adverbial particles.

e.g.:

- I tried to call them up last night.
- Everyone in his family had given him up.
- The intense heat really drags her down.

- On Sundays, he washes it down .

(4) Relative pronoun object

When there is a relative pronoun object in a sentence having a phrasal verb, the adverbial particle cannot come before the relative pronoun but must follow the verb.

e.g.:

- The doctor whom I called up was not at home.
- The words which they copied down were spoken by the Minister of Education.

b. Adverb or adverbial phrase

Referring to patterns I, II and III, the adverbs or adverbial phrases usually come after the adverbial particles or the objects.

- Intan makes up perfectly for the part of Kartini.
- They messed up our bookings well.
- Andi's car had broken down completely.
- The man marked him down quickly.

The combinations of verb and adverbial particle, therefore, are also called separable verbs as Maxine Guin Phinney says that

'One of the interesting things about two word verbs is that they do not always occur together. They can be separated by a noun phrase. They are called separable' 3)

The statement is also confirmed by Marcella Frank in his book Modern English.

'With separable verbs, a personal pronoun must be placed between the verb and the prepositional form.'4)

A.3. Phonological characteristic

The adverbial particle of a phrasal verb is normally stressed and the sentence has a nuclear stress in the end position.

- You must wind 'up the 'clock.
- The clock must be wound 'up.
- The bus ran 'down a 'boy.
- A boy was run down by the 'bus.

B. Prepositional verbs

After surveying the data of verb + particle up combinations and verb + particle down combinations, the writer finds those that belong to this type of combination. They are:

- go up (a)
- climb down (a)
- move up (a)
- stream down

- shin up

- swoop down

- slit up
- suck up
- get up (c)

a. Basic patterns

In this pattern, the object of a prepositional verb is called a prepositional object.

The noun phrases following the prepositions are not the objects but the prepositional complements of the prepositions. The relation between the prepositions and the prepositional complements are more intimate than that between the verbs and the prepositions.

B.2. Syntactic characteristics relating to the sentence patterns

The details of the syntactic characteristics of prepositional verbs relating to the sentence patterns will be explained in terms of the position of object for transitive verbs and the position of adverb for both the transitive and intransitive verbs.

a. Object

(1) Noun or short noun phrase object

The noun or short noun phrase object of a prepositional verb must follow the preposition.

e.g.:

- The chemist sucked up 20 cc of acid.

(2) Extended object

When the object is long, it always comes after the

preposition.

e.g.:

- We expect to get up the filing cabinet which we bought yesterday.
- (3) Personal pronoun object

The personal pronoun object should be put after the preposition.

e.g.:

- I want to get up it.
- (4) Relative pronoun object

The preposition of a prepositional verb in a sentence having a relative pronoun object comes before the relative pronoun.

e.g.:

- The cabinet up which we expect to get is new.

b. Adverb or adverbial phrase

Unlike in phrasal verbs, an adverb or adverbial phrase in a prepositional verb can be placed between the verb and the preposition.

e.g.:

- She has moved very rapidly up the promotion ladder.
- My cat climbed easily down the tree.

B.3. Phonological characteristic

The preposition in a prepositional verb is normally unstressed. In passive sentences, the stress falls on the verb.

- My car will never get up that 'hill.
- He helped me to get down this 'trunk.

- His jacket is 'slit up.
- The acid was 'sucked up into a pipette.

CHAPTER V

THE TEACHING OF VERB + PARTICLE COMBINATIONS

First of all, we will look once more at the difficulties faced by the English learners in Indonesia in learning the verb + particle combinations. The difficulties especially occur in learning the meaning of verb + particle combinations, because one combination may have more than one meaning, and in knowing how they are used in sentences.

In fact, not only the students but the English teachers also have a problem in teaching verb + particle combinations since Indonesian has no such a system. Therefore, in this chapter the writer intends to propose an alternative procedure to teach the verb + particle combinations.

Some people say that verb + particle combinations should be taught as vocabulary teaching for they are concerned more with the meaning. The others regard it as the teaching of grammar as they emphasize on the sentence patterns. In this case, the writer combines both in teaching verb + particle combinations. So, the teaching procedure suggested in this chapter is meant to teach the meaning as well as the patterns of the combinations.

The procedure consists of several steps. The writer includes oral pattern drills since they are useful to make the students familiar with the patterns of verb + particle combinations. Concerning the aim of English

language teaching, communicative activities in the last step is expected to enable the students to use the verb + particle combinations in communication.

Not all of the combinations of verb + particle listed in Chapter II must be taught to the students but we have to select those that are frequently used, particularly for Senior High School students.

For details, let us see the following procedure step by step:

STEP I: Introducing the verb + particle combinations or two-word verbs and explaining the meanings

The teacher starts with introducing what verb + particle combinations are. In English, there are combinations of verb and particle, or to be easier for SMA students, combinations of verb + preposition the meanings of which can sometimes be guessed from the meanings of the individual words and sometimes they have new meanings.

Then, the teacher firstly explains the meanings of two-word verbs which can be guessed from the meaning of each word by demonstrating or using pictures so as to let the students understand the meaning.

e.g.:

- Stand up, please !
- Sit down, please !
- I looked up from my book when you entered the class.
- Tie up your shoes !

- Her mother told herto sweep up her bedroom.
- His hat is always pulled down so that no one knows him.
- My grandmother fell down in the bathroom yesterday.
- Write down your name on this paper !

The demonstration maybe done by the teacher himself or by the students. For those which have new meanings, the teacher can explain them by giving the synonyms, if there are any, or the definitions in English. If the teacher thinks that those ways are still too difficult to show the meanings of the combinations, he may give the translation in Indonesian.

e.g.:

- give up (synonym = surrender)

 After hiding for two weeks, the terrorists gave up last night.
- call up (synonym = telephone)
 I called you up this morning but no one answered.
- keep down (synonym = hide)
 When you came, she kept down behind the door.
- take down (synonym = write)
 The policeman took down all the details of the accident.
- blow up : angry with someone

 The teacher blew Anton up for being late.
- pick up = improve in health

 Tanti has been ill, but now she is picking up.

- run down = menabrak

He was almost run down by a truck.

To practise the meanings, the teacher may order some students to make their own sentences using the two-word verbs.

STEP II : Explaining the patterns

Not all of the patterns in Chapter IV will be taught but only the most important ones, patterns I, II and VI.

The teacher, of course, should consult the dictionaries or grammar books to know which ones are transitive. To show the pattern, the teacher gives some sentences.

- Tie up your shoes
- Tie your shoes up
- Tie them up
- Write down your name
- Write your name down
- Write it down

The teacher asks the students to mention the patterns of the sentences.

The patterns are :

- verb + particle + noun
- verb + noun + particle
- verb + pronoun + particle

They are called phrasal verbs or separable verbs for they can be separated by noun or pronoun.

The examples of inseparable verbs or prepositional verbs are:

- He called on the student.
- He called on him.

(In this case, the writer gives examples of prepositional verbs or inseparable verbs with the combinations of verb and other particle to make them clear)

The patterns are :

- verb + particle + noun
- verb + particle + pronoun

STEP III: Practising the patterns in oral pattern drills

In this step, the students are asked to change the position of noun objects or change the noun objects into personal pronoun objects.

T : He pulled down his hat

S1 : He pulled his hat down

S2 : He pulled it down

T : She tore up the letters

S1 : She tore the letters up

S2 : She tore them up

STEP IV: Practising the meanings and the patterns orally in situational context

The students do not repeat the teacher's sentences and change the position of the objects anymore, but they have to respond to the teacher's questions using two-word

verbs. Therefore, in this step, the students have to understand and memorize the meanings and the patterns of the combinations in order to be able to answer the teacher.

Situational context here means that the questions refer to certain contexts. In this case, the teacher can use pictures or act by himself in asking the students.

e.g.:

T : What am I doing ?

S1 : You are tying up your shoes

T : What is she doing ?

S2: She is sweeping up the room.

T : Are they running up the hill?

S3 : No. They are climbing up the tree

STEP V: Practising in communicative activities

The focus of this step is that the students can express their experiences in their own sentences. In this step, the function of the teacher is to stimulate the students to make their own sentences using the two-word verbs. The teacher can ask the students personal questions in turn or divide them into pairs.

T : Did you sweep up your room this morning ?

S1 : No, I didn't

T : Why ?

S1 : Because I got up late

T : Did you write down everything I said ?

S2 : Yes, I did

T : What about you, Ani ?

S3 : No, I took down only the important things

S1 : Did you call me up last night ?

S2 : No

S1 : Why ?

S2 : I was tired last night and I slept at 8 o'clock

\$3 : Have you written down the homework ?

S4 : No, I forgot it

STEP VI : Giving written exercises

These written exercises are given to the students to be done in class or as homeworks. There are many types of written exercises for verb + particle combinations. The following are some examples of written exercises.

a. Completion :

The students are asked to complete the sentences .
below .

- 1. I can't write anymore. She's ... up my papers.
- He spoke so quickly that we couldn't ... all he said down.
- 3. The gardener spent the afternoon ... up all the dried leaves.
- 4. The cat is afraid to ... down the tree.
- 5. ... up your milk, children!

b. Matching :

This kind of exercises has many variations. It would

be better if the teacher gives the alternatives more than the amount of the sentences so that the students really understand their answers when they choose them. Here are some examples of these exercises:

* Choosing the correct answer

finish up burn down
wake up stand down
set up get down
give up climb down

- 1. You have to your task before you go home.
- 2. A great fire ... more than a hundred houses last month.
- 3. He never although he is blind.
- 4. Will you me tomorrow morning ?
- 5. Steve will if you want the job.
- * Choosing the synonym

recover kill surrender telephone hide write

- 1. Your little brother always <u>keeps down</u> when she comes.
- 2. He doesn't like calling me up in the morning.
- 3. Have they taken down all details of the accident?
- 4. She'll soon pick up after a day in bed.
- c. Question and answer

In this exercise, the students are asked to answer the questions using the combinations of verb + particle or two-word verbs in brackets.

Examples: Would you like to clear the dishes?

(wash up)

- I've already washed them up.
- 1. Don't forget to phone Anita. (ring up)
- 2. Where are your new trousers, Roy ? (hang up)
- 3. Where is the small table in my room ? (get down)
- 4. Don't forget to clear your writing desk.
 (tidy up)

CHAPTER VI

CONCLUSION

After studying the meanings of verb + particle <u>up</u> and verb + particle <u>down</u> combinations and how they are used in sentences, the writer can draw some conclusions about the combinations of two words, i.e., a verb and a particle.

There are three types of meaning of verb + particle and verb + particle down combinations. Firstly, the meaning of the combinations can be guessed from the meanings of the individual words such as climb up, pull down, etc. Secondly, the particle intensifies the meaning of the verb. In this type, the particles of some verb + particle up and verb + particle down combinations can be deleted without making any change to the meaning. They are usually written in parenthesis. For those particles cannot be deleted, they have several meanings concerning their intensifying function. Thirdly, the combinations of verb + particle up and verb + partilce <u>down</u> have new meanings which are different from meanings of the verbs and the particles. Most of the combinations of this type have single word synonyms.

In regard to meaning, the source of difficulty in learning the combinations is that they often do not only have one meaning but several meanings belonging to more than one type of meaning. These differences in meaning for a certain combination of verb and particle depend on

the context in which it occurs. So, to know exactly the meaning of a verb + particle up combination or a verb + particle down combination, we have to look at the context.

Based on the function of the particle, the data listed in Chapter II can be divided into two types. The first type is a combination of a verb and an adverbial particle which is called a phrasal verb, and the second one is a combination of a verb and a preposition which is called a prepositional verb. Both have their own syntactic characteristics relating to the sentence patterns. In spoken language, the particle in a phrasal verb is normally stressed but in a prepositional verb, the stress falls on the verb. Besides, a combination of a verb and a particle up or particle down having more than one meaning is possibly transitive in a certain context and intransitive in another context.

At last, concerning the teaching of verb + particle up and verb + particle down combinations, English teachers have to choose those that are of high frequency in usage to be taught to the students since it will be very difficult for the students, especially Senior High School students, to learn all of the combinations. Furthermore, it is important that teachers do not only teach the meaning or the pattern but both of them because the students are finally expected to be able to use the verb + particle up and verb + particle down combinations in communication.
