PERBEDAAN SIKAP MAHASISWA TERHADAP PERILAKU MENYONTEK DITINJAU DARI IPK DAN MORAL

(Studi Kasus Pada Mahasiswa Universitas Sanata Dharma Yogyakarta)

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Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk mengetahui: (1) perbedaan sikap mahasiswa terhadap perilaku menyontek ditinjau dari IPK; dan (2) perbedaan sikap mahasiswa terhadap perilaku menyontek ditinjau dari moral.

Studi kasus ini dilaksanakan di Universitas Sanata Dharma Yogyakarta angkatan 2015 pada bulan Mei 2016. Instrumen pengumpulan data yang digunakan adalah kuesioner. Jumlah sampel penelitian ini adalah 343 mahasiswa. Teknik pengambilan sampel adalah *Proportional Random Sampling*. Teknik analisis data adalah analisis deskriptif dan analisis *Kruskal-Wallis*.

Hasil penelitian menunjukkan bahwa: (1) ada perbedaan sikap mahasiswa terhadap perilaku menyontek ditinjau dari IPK (*Asymp. Sig = 0,000 < α = 0,05*); dan (2) ada perbedaan sikap mahasiswa terhadap perilaku menyontek ditinjau dari moral (*Asymp. Sig = 0,010 < α = 0,05*).

ABSTRACT

DIFFERENCES IN STUDENTS' ATTITUDES TOWARD CHEATING BEHAVIOR IN TERMS OF GRADE POINT AVERAGE AND MORAL

A Study Case on Students at Sanata Dharma University Yogyakarta

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The study aims to determine: (1) differences in students' attitudes toward cheating behavior in terms of Grade Point Average; and (2) differences in students' attitudes toward cheating behavior in terms of moral.

This case study was conducted at the University of Sanata Dharma Yogyakarta in May 2016. The population were students of 2015 batch. Data collection instrument was questionnaires. Number of samples were 343 students. The technique of taking samples was a proportional sample. The data analysis technique were descriptive analysis and Kruskal-Wallis.

The results show that: (1) there are differences in students' attitudes toward cheating behavior in terms of GPA (Asymp. Sig 0,000 < α = 0,05); and (2) there are differences in students' attitudes toward cheating behavior in terms of moral (Asymp. Sig 0,010 < α = 0,05).
